State of Ohio Orders, Restrictions, and Advisories

- Dr. Acton executed a Stay Safe Ohio Order directing all Ohioans to Stay at Home effective from 11:59 p.m. on Monday, March 23rd through May 29th (copy of order can be found at coronavirus.ohio.gov).
- Governor DeWine recommends all Ohio residents suspend vacation travel
- All K-12 schools are ordered closed effective, Monday, March 16, 2020 through the end of the school year.

Actions Taken to Date

- Governor DeWine has signed an Executive Order providing immediate unemployment benefits to all workers that do not have access to paid leave from an employer
- Established a single website to provide local information on community guidance to include testing protocols, resources, and closures and modifications to service delivery (<https://lucascountyhealth.com/coronavirusupdates/>)
- Established Lucas County Community COVID-19 Call Line, a M-F 0700-1900 centralized phone number for the public to receive answers to clinical questions related to COVID-19

- A Donations Management System and Center has been established to accept and distribute donations
 - Established a landing page to direct donors to the appropriate place to provide their donation – Volunteer, Food, Financial Assistance, Goods (dontateTLC.org)
 - Linked this through our Health Department Coronavirus page as well
 - All donations of goods should be emailed to Donations@co.lucas.oh.us

- Toledo Community Foundation is accepting financial donations to support the response to COVID-19
- United Way is coordinating food donations and volunteers

*Situational Awareness**

**New items are in red.*

- **Senate Bill 310 was passed today (May 6th) in the Ohio General Assembly proposing a formula for the distribution of the \$350 million in Coronavirus Relief Funds allocated to the State of Ohio.**
- The Governor established a plan to begin to re-open Ohio. The plan allows medical procedures not requiring overnight stays to commence on May 1st. Manufacturing, Distribution and Construction as well as General Offices are permitted to reopen on May 4th. Retail is permitted to commence operations on May 12th but employees and customers are recommended to wear face coverings. Restaurants, bars, gyms, barber shops, and any other business not explicitly listed are to remain closed. The State issued a new “Stay Safe Ohio” order that extends both the stay-at-home order and the prohibition against gatherings of over 10 people to May 29th.
- **The State of Ohio is moving from 5 day to 21 day modeling for COVID case and hospitalization analysis and projection.**
- The Toledo-Lucas County Health Department in partnership with Rite-Aid, Kroger, WalMart, and the Neighborhood Health Association announced four public testing locations today. Testing sites will include the Rite Aid location at Airport and Holloway in Springfield Township; Metroparks Hawkins Farmhouse; Nexus Healthcare Center; and Navarre Park Family Care Center. Each organization has agreed to share their testing results with the EOC so that we can track positive and negative tests. Rite Aid’s site has performed 1,799 tests in 14 days of public testing and is reporting a 5.7% positive test rate. Neighborhood Health Association has performed 172 in 6 days of public testing. Kroger’s site performed 435 tests over the course of their three days of public testing at Hawkins Farmhouse and had a 6.4% positive test rate. Testing at Hawkins Farmhouse is currently being conducted by Walmart. Walmart has conducted 164 tests in its first 7 days. Among the corporate partners, 2,725 public tests have been performed.
- Walgreens reached out to discuss potentially opening another public testing site in the southern portion of the County.
- **Kroger has expressed an interest in opening an additional test site at St. Luke’s hospital.**
- **The Toledo-Lucas County Health Department has received an additional 400 tests from the Ohio Department of Health bringing their total stock of tests to 1,200.**
- **ODH updated its test priorities merging priority 2A (symptomatic and asymptomatic residents and employees of long term care facilities) into priority 2.**
- The Toledo-Lucas County Health Department secured a source (Quest) for universal testing of all Long Term Care Facility residents and staff. As of 5:30 PM on Friday, May

1st, 24 of 53 facilities have established accounts and have received supplies, 17 facilities are pending or made contact with Quest, and 12 facilities have stated they are not interested in the testing resource. The HMAC has requested to extend this testing resource to all Long Term Care Facilities in Region 1.

- The Toledo-Lucas County Health Department and the Toledo-Lucas County Homelessness Board are discussing the feasibility of testing individuals in homeless shelters.
- Lucas County will receive two more deliveries of personal protective equipment (PPE) this week. The first of these deliveries was received on Monday and the second is expected today (Wednesday, May 6th).
- A non-congregate sheltering resource for first responders, health care workers, and the unhoused in isolation or quarantine is operational. There are currently 10 individuals in the non-congregate shelter. In order to protect the privacy of these individuals, the location of the shelter will not be publicly disseminated.
- A sheltering resource for first responders not in isolation or quarantine but needing housing has been established. Currently, there are three first responders in this semi-congregate shelter.
- The Lucas County EOC further virtualized operations effective Monday, May 4th. EOC briefings will be conducted each week on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday at 10 AM.

Resource Needs and Information Requests

The following significant resource needs and information requests have been fulfilled:

- Confirmed current stock and project additional tests to be provided to Lucas County from the Ohio Department of Health to support public testing
- Acquired Quest phone number for long term care facilities to ask questions about testing and reimbursement.

The following significant resource needs and information requests are outstanding:

- Numerous PPE requests
- Temporal thermometers
- Acquire public test results from NHA and Rite Aid
- Identify how to bill the National Disaster Medical System for testing individuals without insurance.
- Identify how Lucas County's deaths above normal compare to other similarly situated counties.
- Confirm Walgreens support for public testing location and start date.
- Identify sites and security for Connecting Kids to Meals.
- **Identify end date for Walmart and Rite Aid public testing**
- **Determine if ProMedica has capacity to support antibody testing of all first responders.**

Incident Objectives

The following objectives have been recently completed:

- Distributed information regarding application for FEMA Public Assistance for governments, hospitals, and non-profit organizations
- Established protocol for government offices, businesses, etc. for how to handle a positive COVID-19 case among their workforce, including contact and cleaning guidance.
- Obtained a call-in number for people with access and functional needs to report needs related to COVID-19 (419-885-5733)

Our top objectives for the next planning period are projected as:

- Establish a strategy to provide testing to individuals residing in homeless shelters
- Identify a testing location for Walgreens
- **Coordinate St. Luke's hospital testing site with Kroger**

The following other objectives have been identified:

- Address the disproportionate impact of COVID-19 on communities of social vulnerability
- Establish a weekly PPE tracking tool that provides current PPE resources in hospitals, long term care facilities, fire service, and law enforcement as well as current supply chain.
- Complete a Memorandum of Agreement with Toledo Memorial Park and the Catholic Cemeteries for mass burial services.
